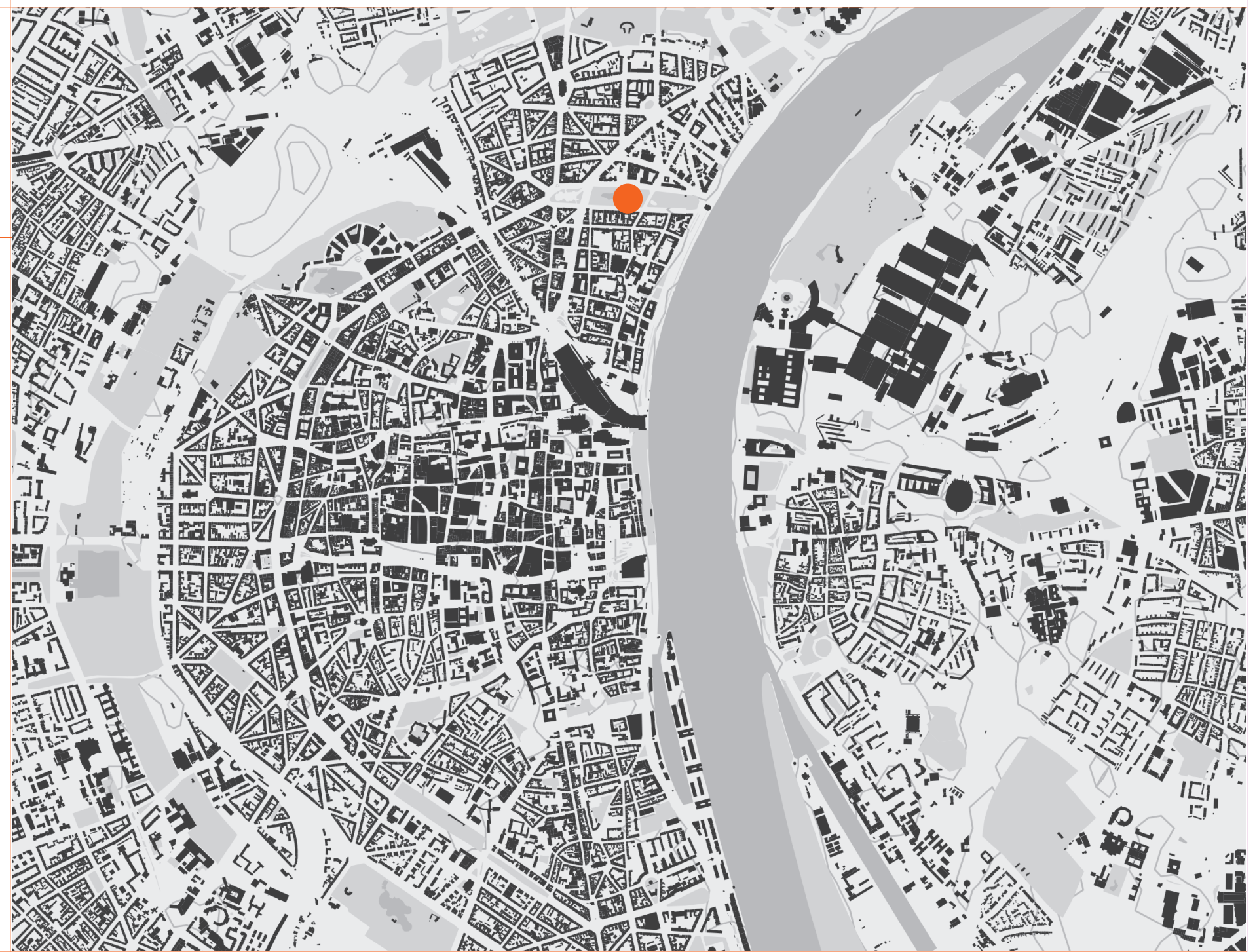
How can we change the relationship we have with our food and develop a sense of responsibility and engagement amongst citizens? - Micro scale

Abstract

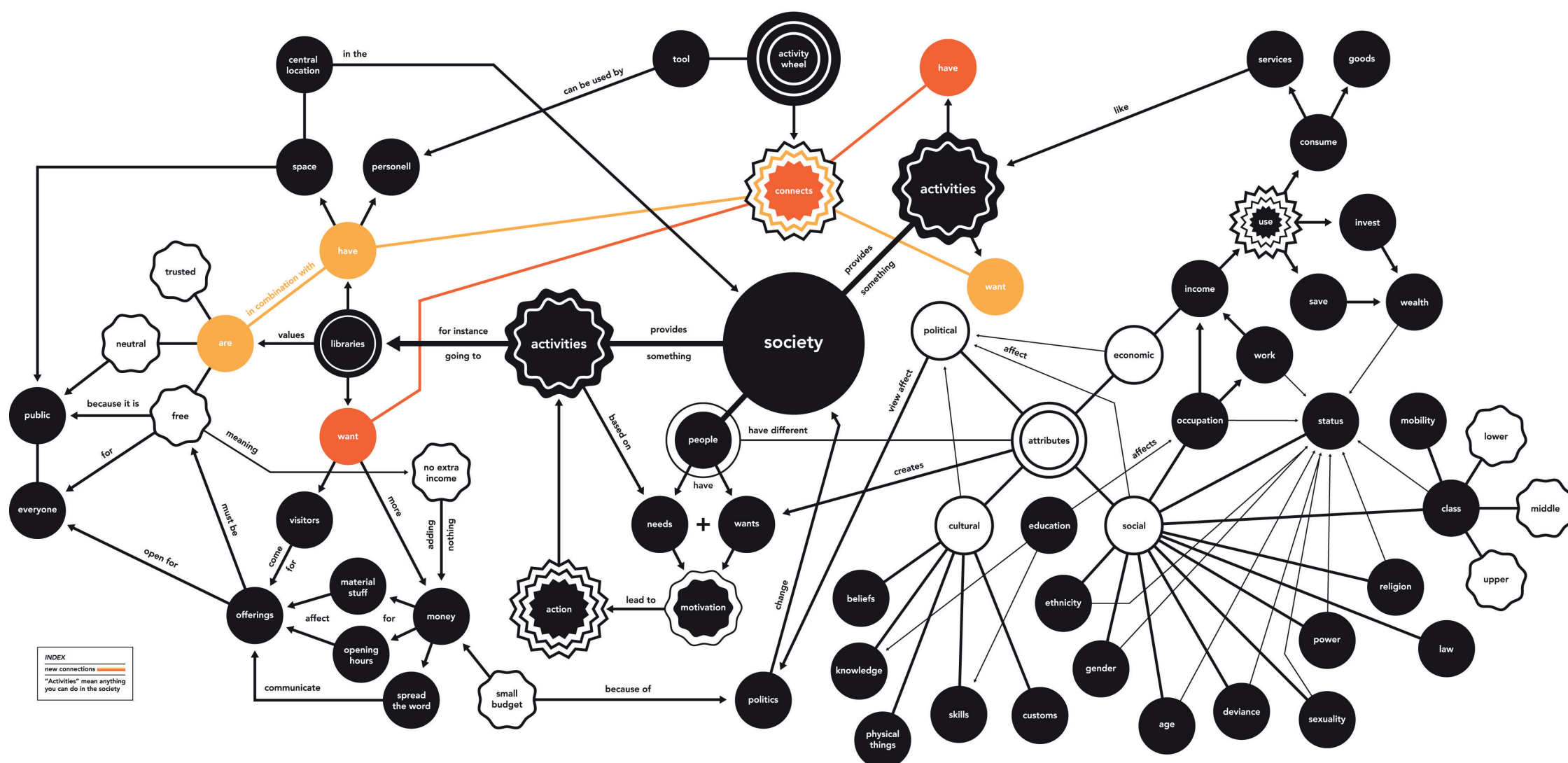
80/20 is a concept for the UniMensa restoration in the year 2030 with the purpose of improving students' diet and lifestyle. The 80 stands for 80% plant based and the 20 for 20% animal based, which will be the plant- and animal products ratio to be found at the canteen.

The current menu offer at the Cologne Uni-Mensa is still not environmentally sustainable enough, meat and dairy production alone account for 14.5 percent of the world's greenhouse gas emissions. Changes, partially requested by students themselves, are necessary. Adjustments need to be made, starting by reducing the number of dishes the students can choose from on a daily basis.

At present 12 dishes, reducing the amount to 4, which would be enough as well. Thereby variety, which the students were not satisfied with, throughout the week can be increased. The 80/20 programme to be used in the Mensa will ideally take care of all dietary concerns and turn conscious eating into an easy action by counselling the customer about the food that is available briefly and succinctly. Targeting peoples eating behaviours early on, a long-term dietary improvement will be possible.

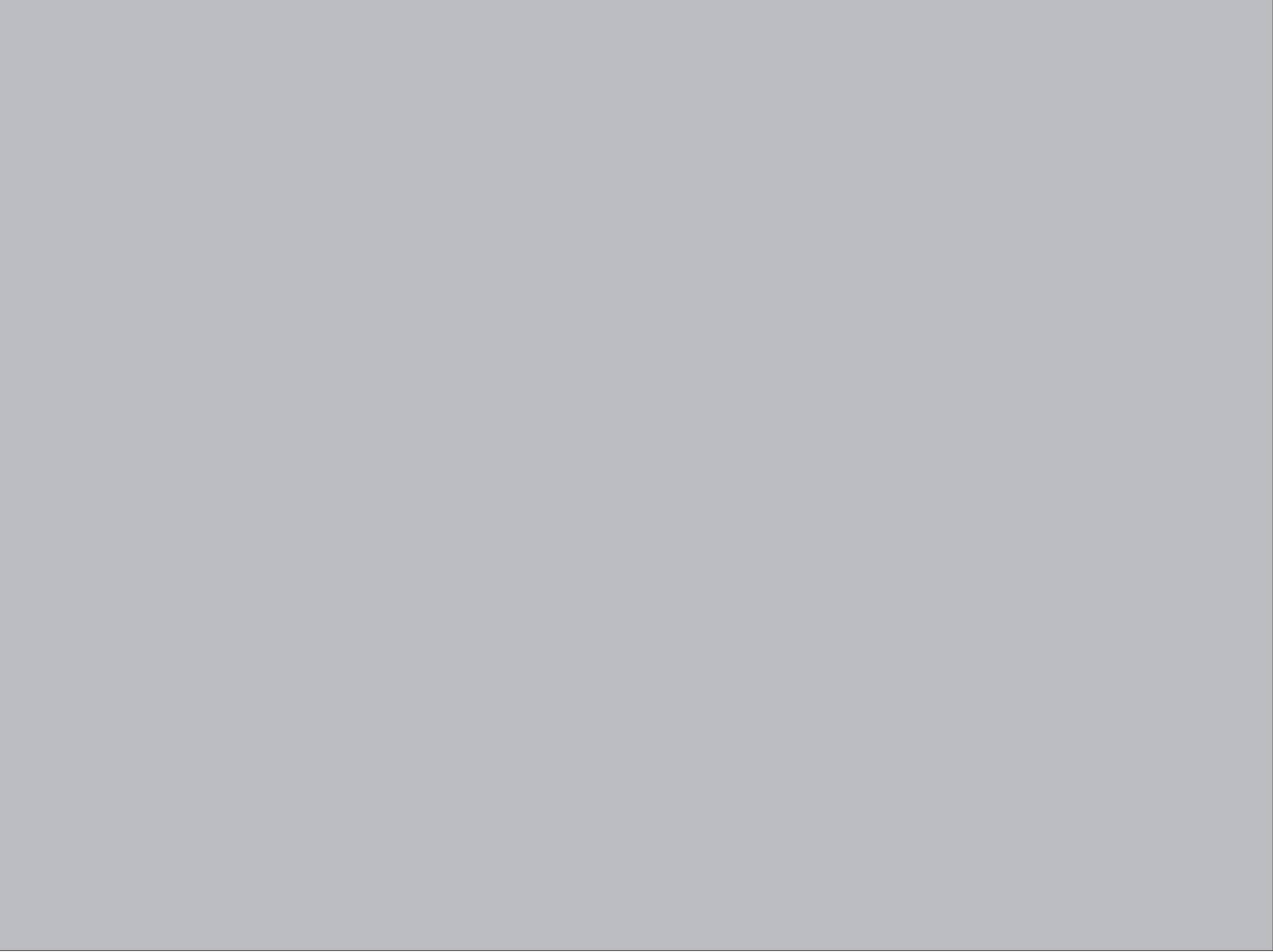
